STAR-SPANGLED BANNERF.S. Key and J.S. Smith We SHALL WALK THROUGH THE VALLEYarr. Undine Smith Moore

The elegant, hymn-like setting of this African-American spiritual is a reminder of the power of simplicity. After a simple introduction, the original tune comes in and instills the spirit of courage and perseverance through life's difficulties. Undine Smith Moore was dubbed the "Dean of Black Women Composers," having achieved recognition during her lifetime for her vocal, piano, and choral works.

DANNY BOY F.E. Wetherby arr. Joseph Flummerfelt

This traditional Irish folk tune showcases the choral sound through the simplicity of a familiar melody. The highest note, which soars up and ends on the final note of "come ye back," evokes a sense of hope for the chance of meeting again those who have been recently lost to us. Flummerfelt served for decades as the conductor of the Westminster College Choir and the New York Philharmonic.

Тне Road Home Stephen Paulus Soloist: Lorena Bobnick McIntyre

Originally commissioned for the Dale Warland Singers, this folk arrangement was written based on the tune *The Lone Wild Bird*. The tune makes use of the pentatonic scale which is used in most musical cultures. The text was written by Michael Dennis Browne using the themes of "returning" and "coming home," which is appropriate as our lives begin again after a pandemic.

I'LL BE ON MY WAYShawn Kirchner

Soloists: Suzanne Scheuring & Jarrod Ashley-VanDuser An inspirational memorial song that moves from a sense of sorrow into great joy. A slow opening, sung by a soloist, captures a feeling of reverence before a light, banjo-inspired piano accompaniment launches the spirit-freeing remainder of the piece. The rising, arpeggio motif of the chorus to the words "I'll Be On My Way" fills both the singers and the audience with joy. *⇒ Brief Intermission ⇒* (While band members set up)

THE HIGH SCHOOL CADETS John Phillip Sousa

This 1890 march by Sousa was written at the request of the Washington High School cadet drill team in Washington, D.C. after Sousa had written a march for their rival school two years earlier. The piece became popular through early recordings, including one by Pat Conway's famous Ithaca Band.

PRELUDE AND FUGUE IN B-FLATJ.S. Bach

Written for organ circa 1740, this piece comes from a collection of eight preludes (short introductory pieces of music during the Baroque era) and fugues (pieces that repeat and adapt a central theme). There is debate among scholars over whether it was written by Bach or his pupil Johann Tobias Krebs.

MORCEAU SYMPHONIQUE Alexandre Guilmant arr. Wesley Shepard; Trombone Soloist: Adam Phillips-Burge

Although Guilmant was a French professor and talented organist, this piece highlights the trombone, which was growing in popularity. Written in 1902, the piece was written as an examination piece for students at the Paris Conservatory.

SALVATION IS CREATED...... Pavel Chesnokov arr. Bruce H. Houseknecht

A professor at the Moscow Conservatory, Chesnokov wrote this piece in 1912 among nearly 400 sacred choral works. When church music was suppressed after the Russian Revolution, he transitioned to composing non-religious music, stopping altogether when the cathedral at which he was choirmaster was demolished.

AMERICAN CIVIL WAR FANTASY......Jerry H. Bilk

This 1961 medley is filled with traditional Civil War tunes, including *Listen to The Mocking Bird*; *Dixieland*; *Camptown Races*; *John Brown's Body*; *Dixie*; *Battle Cry Of Freedom*; *Maryland*, *My Maryland*; *When Johnny Comes Marching Home*; *Just Before The Battle*, *Mother*; *Marching Through Georgia*; *The Yellow Rose Of Texas*; *and Battle Hymn Of The Republic*.

Participants

The 2022 band and chorus participants range in age from 14 to 88, include at least 5 family groups, and represent 15 area communities: Binghamton, Cortland, DeRuyter, Dryden, Etna, Freeville, Groton, Harford, Homer, Ithaca, Lansing, Marathon, Moravia, Troy (Pennsylvania), and Virgil.
